

Daily Health Check

A Daily Health screen will be conducted on each person (staff, families and children) prior to or upon arrival at the center. Temperature checks will be conducted on each person arriving. If an individual who is not part of the household comes to the center for drop off or pick up, they must be screened individually, including a temperature check.

1. TEMPERATURE CHECK:

A designated staff member will take the temperature of each person and any person/household with a fever at or above the threshold temperature will **NOT** be permitted to enter.

2. SCREENING QUESTIONS: For on-site screening

Any household answering "YES" to ANY question may NOT be permitted to enter.

IF YOUR LOCALITY HAS ADDITIONAL SYMPTOMS YOU ARE REQUIRED TO SCREEN FOR PLEASE ADD.

Please be sure your responses are accurate and include ALL members of your household, including houseguests:

- A. In the **preceding 72 hours**, has anyone in your household had any of the following symptoms?
 - A cough
 - A sore throat
 - Muscle aches
 - Difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever at or above the *threshold temperature of 100.4° F (or would have, but for the use of fever-reducing medicine).

[The threshold temperature is **100.4° F**, unless a LOWER threshold temperature is imposed in the local jurisdiction or by the specific center.]

- B. Within the last 10 days, has anyone in your household:
 - Had a confirmed case of COVID-19?
 - Had close contact with anyone with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19?
 - Been tested or advised to be tested due to a known/suspected exposure to COVID-19?
 - Been advised or directed to quarantine or self-isolate due to COVID-19?
 - Who is unvaccinated, travelled internationally?
- C. Is anyone in your household:
 - Awaiting COVID-19 test results?
 - o Going to be tested for COVID-19 in the next 24 hours?

Explanatory Notes for Daily Health Screen:

Note 1 - Previously Cleared Symptom:

If the exclusionary symptom has already been cleared by the COVID team, then a "yes" to the continuing presence of a **cleared** symptom will not result in an exclusion.

Note 2 – Screening members who are fully vaccinated or previously positive:

The daily screening process remains the same and a ONEsupport ticket should be submitted. Include the vaccination status or previous positive details in the ticket so those facts can be considered for guidance. In most cases, individuals who fall into either of these categories will not need to be excluded.

Note 3 – Testing and Scheduled Testing:

If there are outstanding COVID-19 test results the household should remain out until a negative test result has been received. If a member of a household has been tested as part of a standard, scheduled testing protocol by their employer and not due to that individual's symptoms or possible exposure: **THEN** the household will NOT be excluded, **UNLESS/UNTIL** a positive result is received.

Note 4 - Close Contact Defined:

Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.

Note 5 - Travel Exclusion:

Only the household member who traveled internationally when not fully vaccinated must remain out for 5 days after returning and return on day 6. This includes drop off and pick ups.

SCREENING INSTRUCTIONS FOR STAFF CONDUCTING DAILY HEALTH CHECK

- 1. Wear outer garment
- 2. Wear mask
- 3. Wear visor
- 4. Wear gloves
- 5. Taking Temperatures:
 - a. *If using NON-CONTACT thermometers*:
 - gloves do not need to be changed between individuals
 - thermometer DOES need to be cleaned after each individual
 - b. *If using EarThermometers*:
 - gloves DO need to be changed between each individual
 - thermometer DOES need to be cleaned after each individual
- 6. Discard gloves and covers in covered trash bin
- 7. Hand hygiene wash hands often
- 8. Launder clothing or place potentially contaminated clothing into a sealed bag
