



Daily Health Check Questions as of November 19, 2020

A Daily Health Check will be conducted on every person (all staff, families and children) entering the center:

1. TEMPERATURE CHECK:

A designated staff member will take the temperature of each person and any person/household with a fever at or above the threshold temperature will **NOT** be permitted to enter.

2. SCREENING QUESTIONS:

For any household, which has NOT used the health screen application prior to arriving, ask the following questions and any household answering "YES" to ANY question may NOT be permitted to enter. **Please be sure your responses are accurate and include ALL members of your household, including houseguests:**

- A. In the **preceding 72 hours**, has anyone in your household had any of the following COVID-19-like Symptoms?
- A cough
 - A sore throat
 - Muscle aches
 - Difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever at or above the threshold temperature of 100.4° F (or would have, but for the use of fever-reducing medicine).
*[The threshold temperature is **100.4° F**, unless a LOWER threshold temperature is imposed in the local jurisdiction or by the specific center.]*
- B. **Washington State Required Questions:**
These questions pertain to the **individual child or staff member** entering the building:
Should you answer **YES** to any of these you will **NOT** be permitted to enter the building
- Have fatigue
 - Have congestion or a runny nose
 - Have a headache
 - Have nausea or vomiting
 - Have diarrhea
- C. Has anyone in your household:
- Within the last 14 days:
 - Had a confirmed case of COVID-19?
 - Had close contact with anyone with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19?

- Been tested or advised to be tested due to a known/suspected exposure to COVID-19?
 - Been advised or directed to quarantine or self-isolate due to COVID-19?
 - Within the last 7 days:
 - Attended a gathering (indoor or outdoor) where attendance exceeded or which was otherwise not in compliance with recommended guidance? **(no indoor gathering of any kind and no more than 5 individuals at an outdoor gathering)** If yes, the household will be excluded for one week.
- C. Is anyone in your household:
- Supposed to be quarantining/remaining out due to domestic or international travel? **(WA state travel guidance requires anyone who has traveled outside of WA state, for non-essential travel, to quarantine for 14 days upon their return)**
 - Awaiting COVID-19 test results?
 - Going to be tested for COVID-19 in the next 24 hours?

Explanatory Notes for Daily Health Screen:

Note 1 - Previously Cleared Symptom:

If the exclusionary symptom has already been cleared by the COVID team, then a “yes” to the continuing presence of a **cleared** symptom will not result in an exclusion.

Note 2 - Scheduled Testing:

If a member of a household has been tested as part of a standard, scheduled testing protocol by their employer and not due to that individual’s symptoms or possible exposure: **THEN** the household will NOT be excluded, **UNLESS/UNTIL** a positive result is received.

Note 3 - Close Contact Defined:

Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period* starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.

Note 4 - Travel Exclusion:

This does not exclude the entire household, only household member who traveled to or from restricted area must remain out (including drop off and pickup).

Note 5 – Gathering Exclusion:

Be familiar with the local gathering guidance. When determining whether a household has exceeded the gathering guidance apply to local guidance, regardless of where the gathering occurred. The day of the *last* gathering is considered day 1 of the exclusion period.
